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Pump Service Test

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MAR your department certifying your emergency apparatus? There are several items that the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) recommends testing on a regular basis. Some of the most common items are your fire pump and aerial device. Most companies choose to complete these certifications annually or biennially.

Pump certification is series of tests performed on your truck's fire pump to check for proper operation and output. The test looks at several aspects of the pump including its ability to pull prime, ensuring that it can hold a vacuum, checking for rated pump output, checking overload capability, verifying tank to pump flow rate, and more. It is also a good test of several other systems on your apparatus since the engine will be running at high

RPM for an extended time and all emergency and scene lights will be operating. This can help find any cooling system, electrical, or other problems that may exist. The NFPA and the Insurance Services Office, Inc. (ISO) both recommend annual pump testing. One major benefit of having a test completed every year is peace

of mind knowing that your pump is capable of meeting and maintaining factory flow specs for long periods of time when needed. This also gives you the opportunity to compare the results and take note of any significant changes. Some other benefits are the opportunity to find and fix minor issues before they become a bigger problem, keeping track of normal wear through the years to keep tabs on pump health, and the often-overlooked benefit of helping to keep homeowner's insurance rates lower for members of your community.

Aerial certification refers to inspection or testing of the aerial device on your truck. The NFPA calls for an annual visual inspection and operational test, and nondestructive testing (NDT) every 5 years. You should also have these tests performed any time the aerial device was damaged, stressed beyond normal limits, or has had significant

repair work completed. These tests are important to monitor the condition of vour aerial device and make sure it is safe for your personnel

and any one to whom they are rendering aid.

A qualified technician will check a long list of items including the operation and structural condition of the ladder or boom, the condition and operation of the outriggers, all interlocks and safety features, all hydraulic cylinders, the condition and adjustment of all wire cables, all of the electrical wiring associated with the aerial,

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the condition and function of the pump and waterways, the breathing air system, the condition of the cab and chassis, and much more. Having your aerial inspected on a regular basis is an important part of maintaining a safe fleet and should be a priority for your department.

These tests, along with other

items such as ground ladder testing, fire hose testing, SCBA flow testing, patient compartment inspection, etc., should be performed regularly to ensure that your apparatus and equipment are safe and ready to go at a moment's notice. Consider adding these items to your regular maintenance program if they are not already being performed.
